### **PROCEEDINGS**

Chair Tony Wilder called the meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) Board to order. Commissioner Wilder confirmed that a quorum was present and that the press had been notified regarding the meeting. The Commissioner asked board members and guests to introduce themselves.

### I. <u>BUSINESS (Board Action Required)</u>

### **APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

For: KIA Regular Board Meeting of September 3, 2015

Ms. Linda Bridwell moved to approve the minutes of the September 3, 2015, regular board meeting. Mr. Jeff Derouen seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

### **NEW PROJECTS/ACTION ITEMS**

1. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING THE CHAIR TO EXECUTE AGREEMENTS ON BEHALF OF THE AUTHORITY

Commissioner Tony Wilder discussed with the group the departure of Executive Director John Covington. Commissioner Wilder informed the board that Adam Scott would be handling the day-to-day operations of KIA. Mr. Scott and Mr. Russ Salsman, KIA Deputy Director, would need signatory authority for administrative activities until a new Executive Director has been put in place.

Mr. Jeff Derouen moved to approve the motion for the administrative signatory authorization, Ms. Sandy Williams seconded and the motion was unanimously approve.

2. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR AN INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (B15-001) INCREASING THE AMOUNT TO \$606,700 TO THE CITY OF HUSTONVILLE, LINCOLN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Ms. Jami Johnson, KIA, discussed the City of Hustonville's request for an increase of \$130,300 to an existing \$476,400 Fund "B" loan. The City received seven bids during the bid opening period. After reviewing the lowest bidder, additional funds were required to complete the project. The original project description is below:

The City of Hustonville is requesting a Fund "B" loan in the amount of \$476,400 for the Water System Improvement Project. The project will replace 16,000 linear feet of aged cast iron waterlines with four and six inch PVC lines. The existing lines are undersized and breaking preventing safe reliable drinking water. Frequent boil water advisories cause a significant hardship for the local elementary school. An additional 800 feet of water lines will be installed at the Huston Point Crossing to improve water pressure in the area. Meters that are connected to the aged lines will be replaced from Liberty to Mt Salem Road. The project will save approximately 10% of water consumption upon completion.

The City serves approximately 1,800 water customers and purchases an average of 125 million gallons of water per year from the City of Danville at an average cost of \$1.65 per thousand gallons. Danville has recently announced a 50% rate increase to \$2.47 per

thousand gallons. This increase is to support the water treatment project that Danville has recently undertaken.

Ms. Sandy Williams abstained from voting. Ms. Linda Bridwell moved to approve the increase to the Fund B loan (B15-001) in the amount of \$130,300 to the previously approved \$476,400 Fund B Loan to the City of Hustonville with the standard conditions. Ms. Lona Brewer seconded and the motion was unanimously approve.

3. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F16-021) IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1,039,500 TO THE CRITTENDEN-LIVINGSTON COUNTY WATER DISTRICT, LIVINGSTON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Ms. Sarah Aitken, KIA, discussed the Crittenden-Livingston County Water District's request for a Fund F Loan (F16-021) in the amount of \$1,039,500 for the Moore Hill Tank project.

The project will construct a 400,000 gallon elevated water tank on Moore Hill to replace a smaller standpipe tank installed in 1972. The project will increase pressure and relieve a bottle neck in the system allowing more water to be fed into the 600,000 gallon tank in the City of Marion.

The new tank will provide an additional 250,000 gallons of storage. The District provides services for Caldwell, Crittenden, and Livingston counties. Providers that purchase water from this system include Grand Rivers Water System, Ledbetter Water District, Lyon County Water District, Marion Water Department, Salem Municipal Water System and Smithland Water and Sewer System.

Mr. Jeff Derouen abstained from voting. Ms. Linda Bridwell made the motion to approve the Fund F loan (F16-021)) in the amount of \$1,039,500 to the Crittenden-Livingston County Water District with the standard conditions. Mr. Ron Lovan seconded and the motion was unanimously approve.

4. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F16-032) IN THE AMOUNT OF \$700,000 TO THE CAVE RUN WATER COMMISSION, MENIFEE COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Ms. Jami Johnson, KIA, discussed the Cave Run Water Commission's request for a Fund F Loan (F16-032) in the amount of \$700,000. The project will install and replace various items at the water treatment plant and raw water intake. Improvements include instillation of a variable frequency drive, tube settlers and launders and replacing a filter media. The improvements at the raw water intake will allow continued service in the event of a flooding situation. The improvements at the water treatment plant will allow for more effective water treatment with the removal of pollutants.

The Cave Run Water Commission provides water services the City of Frenchburg, the City of Jeffersonville and the Morgan County Water District.

Ms. Lona Brewer moved to approve the Fund F loan (F16-032) to the amount of \$700,000 to the Cave Run Water Commission with the standard conditions along with the following special conditions. The Cave Run Water Commission shall increase utility rates sufficient to generate an additional \$40,000 in cash flow effective no later than July 1, 2017, and \$40,000 in cash flow effective no later than July 1, 2018. Both increases must be passed within the same ordinance prior to the issuance of an Assistance Agreement. Mr. Linda Bridwell seconded and the motion was unanimously approve.

5. A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

This is a routine resolution allowing KIA to reimburse expenses that are paid out of the Authority's funds with bond proceeds. The projects listed below are covered under this resolution:

Ms. Linda Bridwell moved to approve the resolution. Mr. Ron Lovan seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

Ms. Linda Bridwell made the motion to adjourn to an Executive Session. Mr. John Fischer seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

After a brief Executive Session, Ms. Linda Bridwell made the motion to reconvene the KIA Board meeting. Mr. Ron Lovan seconded and the motion carried unanimously. No actions were taken by the Executive Committee at this time.

### **EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT**

Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Secretary Adam Scott addressed the group updating them on information previously reported by Mr. John Covington. At the August meeting, Mr. Covington mentioned the Call for Projects. The process begins today, October 1<sup>st</sup> and ends on December 11<sup>th</sup>. KIA staff will work with DOW to rank the projects accordingly. This is now a streamlined automated process. At this point in time, everyone understands the system and it is much less cumbersome.

Mr. Covington had also mentioned in a previous meeting a surplus of funds available for Clean Water projects. This is the first year to have a surplus of funds. KIA staff has

reviewed the projects and 21 additional projects have been invited from the Drinking Water IUP. The Area Development Districts were polled and they submitted 8 additional projects totaling \$8,000,000, leaving around \$35,000,000. The KIA staff has been working with the EPA Region 4 to ensure the money is transitioned appropriately. KIA is allowed to transfer funds through language in the Intended Use Plan (IUP). Mr. Scott said this is a great opportunity to eliminate some projects that have been bottlenecked due to the lack of funding.

Mr. Scott reminded the Board of previous discussions on abandonment of Package Treatment Plants (PTP). This is a growing concern; the Public Service Commission (PSC) has 37 that are utilities with a process in place for abandonment. There are over 400 in the state that are not utilities and could shut down at a moment's notice. KIA staff has been generating a list of potential abandonments. At one time, there was KSWIG, Kentucky Sewer Water Interagency Group. Mr. Scott and others from the Division of Water (DOW) and the Public Service Commission (PSC) are interested in resurrecting the group to discuss and possibly avert future problems with abandonments as well as other pertinent issues.

A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A13-020) INCREASING THE AMOUNT TO \$4,365,793 TO THE LINCOLN COUNTY SANITATION DISTRICT, LINCOLN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

**WHEREAS**, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority previously approved a Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund Loan (A13-020) to the Lincoln County Sanitation District on June 19, 2013, in the amount of \$2,000,000 and the Lincoln County Sanitation District has requested to increase loan A13-020 by \$2,365,793; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the Lincoln County Sanitation District, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of its Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

Section 2. The Authority hereby authorizes the Amendment of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund loan increasing the amount to \$4,365,793 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the Lincoln County Sanitation District for the Phase 1 Sewer Project and Hustonville- Phase 1A Sewer Project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Authority staff at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the project cost authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of 32% will be deducted from the approved loan amount. The unforgiven principal balance of \$2,965,793 shall be repaid.

Section 4. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 30 years at an interest rate of 0.75%. In addition to debt service, a .20% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$10,900 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$109,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 5th day of November, 2015.

The Division of Water (DOW) hereby certifies that the Lincoln County Sanitation District is eligible to receive an additional \$2,365,793.00 to go along with their initial \$2,000,000.00 loan bringing their total loan from the Clean Water State Revolving Fund to \$4,365,793.00. The DOW certifies that the project scope is consistent with the scope that was used to rank the project on the Intended Use Plan-Project Priority List.

### I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Lincoln County Sanitation District is requesting a \$2,365,793 increase to a Fund A loan that was previously approved on June 19, 2013 for \$2,000,000 for the Phase 1 Sewer Project. After the original project was approved, at the request of Department of Local Government, the District expanded the scope of the project to serve a portion of the City of Hustonville (labeled Hustonville-Phase 1A Sewer Project), including the Hustonville Elementary School. All portions (Phase 1 and Phase 1A) of the project will served a total of 593 unserved customers in the US 127 Corridor. The District has agreements with both the City of Danville for the treatment of wastewater and City of Hustonville for operations and maintenance. The original project description is below:

This project will provide wastewater collection and treatment to approximately 445 unserved residential and commercial customers in the western portion of Lincoln County. The area includes US 127 south of Junction City and proceeding to the Moreland area. Current waste disposal methods consist of septic tanks and straight pipes which results in the discharge of raw sewage and septic tank effluent to the ground surface.

The District was established on May 10, 2011 by the Lincoln County Fiscal Court. The District is governed by five directors who are appointed by the County Judge Executive and approved by the fiscal court. Connection to the public wastewater system is mandatory within four months of the date that a property owner is notified that service is available.

### IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS (See Exhibit 1)

This is a new utility and there is no financial history. Audited financial statements will be required annually once the District enters into an Assistance Agreement with KIA.

### **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Revenues will be sufficient to fund debt service, required reserves, operating expenses and a depreciation reserve. The revenue forecast is based on 593 customers with an average water use of 4,000 gallons per month.
- 2) Expenses are based on a budget that was provided by the applicant. Treatment costs from the City of Danville will initially be \$1.96 per thousand gallons.
- 3) Debt service coverage is 1.6 in 2018 when full year principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the proforma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

### REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The annual replacement cost is \$10,900. This amount should be added to the replacement account each December 1 until the balance reaches \$109,000 and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A16-004) IN THE AMOUNT OF \$848,000 TO THE MERCER COUNTY SANITATION DISTRICT, MERCER COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the Mercer County Sanitation District, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of its Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund A loan for \$848,000 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the Mercer County Sanitation District for

the Kennedy Bridge Road Sanitary Sewer Improvements Project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Authority staff at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the project cost authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 1.75%. In addition to debt service, a 0.2% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$2,100 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$21,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 5th day of November 2015.

### I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Mercer County Sanitation District is requesting a Fund "A" loan in the amount of \$848,000 for the Kennedy Bridge Road Sanitary Sewer Improvements project. The project will install new sanitary sewer collection mains which will be extended from an existing system in Chimney Rock. The areas to receive new sewer service include 1599 Kennedy Bridge Road, a mobile home park consisting of 25 lots and Maple Hill Subdivision consisting of 9 single family homes currently served by onsite septic systems and an apartment complex located at 1603 Kennedy Bridge Road, consisting of 15 residential apartment units served by an onsite septic system.

The project scope includes the construction of approximately 2,000 linear feet of 8" gravity sewer main and 1,000 linear feet of 3" sewer force main. The existing collection system is connected to a privately owned package treatment plant. The KPDES permit for the plant indicates that capacity is available to provide treatment for additional properties located in the vicinity of the plant. The plant discharge is currently in compliance, but the plant is aging and requires renovation to maintain reliable operation, therefore the scope will include an upgrade to the existing package treatment plant. This upgrade will include new structure and new equipment. The project would eliminate approximately 35 aged and inadequate onsite septic systems, eliminate infiltration of sewage to the Herrington Lake watershed and protect the health of the citizens that reside in the three unserved areas.

The Mercer County Sanitation District provides sewer service to 211 households within Mercer County.

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2012 through 2014. Amounts for 2015 are estimated. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

### HISTORY

Operating revenues increased 69% from 2012 to 2014 from \$101,467 to \$171,690. Operating expenses increased 23% from \$130,822 to \$161,189. The debt coverage was (1.3), 0.9 and 0.8 for years 2012 through 2014, respectively.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 1.3, a debt to equity ratio of 0.3 and unrestricted cash equals 0.5 months of operating expenses.

### **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Sewer revenues reflect a previously approved 10% rate increase that was passed in August of 2014. Sewer revenues will be adjusted by an amount to increase revenues by \$30,000 or 15% by July, 1, 2017 and will remain flat thereafter.
- 2) Operating expenses will increase by 2% per year.
- 3) Debt service coverage is 1.1 in 2018 when full year principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the proforma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

The annual replacement cost is \$2,100. This amount should be added to the replacement account each December 1 until the balance reaches \$21,000 and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A16-003) IN THE AMOUNT OF \$2,033,200 TO THE CITY OF PRESTONSBURG FOR THE BENEFIT OF PRESTONSBURG UTILITY COMMISSION, FLOYD COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the City of Prestonsburg for the benefit of Prestonsburg Utility Commission, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of its Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund loan for \$2,033,200 of project expense including

capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Prestonsburg for the benefit of Prestonsburg Utility Commission for the Kennedy Bridge Road Sanitary Sewer Improvements Project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Authority staff at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the project cost authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of 25% will be deducted from the approved loan amount. The unforgiven principal balance of \$1,524,900 shall be repaid.

Section 4. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 0.75%. In addition to debt service, a 0.2% annual administration fee on the unpaid, unforgiven principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$5,100 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$51,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 5th day of November, 2015.

### IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS (See Exhibit 1)

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2012 through 2014. Amounts for 2015 are estimated. The Commission reports water, gas and sewer services in a combined statement. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

### **HISTORY**

Operating revenues increased 11% from 2012 to 2014 from \$7.4 million to \$8.2 million. Sewer revenues increase 15% from \$1.1 million to \$1.2 million during the same period. Operating expenses increased 9% from \$5.8 million to \$6.4 million. The increase is due to higher gas purchases along with increases in personnel costs. The debt coverage ratio remained consistent from 0.9 in 2012 to 0.9 in 2014.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 1.2, a debt to equity ratio of 0.8 and unrestricted cash equals 1.2 months of operating expenses.

### **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Water revenues reflect all previously approved rate increases as well as a 3% annual inflation increase due to a CPI clause.
- 2) Sewer revenues will be adjusted by an amount to increase revenues by \$80,000 or 6% by July 1, 2017 and will remain flat thereafter.
- 3) Gas revenues will remain flat.
- 4) Operating expenses will increase by 2% per year.
- 5) Debt service coverage is 1.0 in 2018 when full year principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the proforma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

### REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The annual replacement cost is \$5,100. This amount should be added to the replacement account each December 1 until the balance reaches \$51,000 and maintained for the life of the loan.

Operating revenues increased 11% from 2012 to 2014 from \$7.4 million to \$8.2 million. Sewer revenues increase 15% from \$1.1 million to \$1.2 million during the same period. Operating expenses increased 9% from \$5.8 million to \$6.4 million. The increase is due to higher gas purchases along with increases in personnel costs. The debt coverage ratio remained consistent from 0.9 in 2012 to 0.9 in 2014.

### **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

Based on the proforma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

### REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The annual replacement cost is \$5,400. This amount should be added to the replacement account each December 1 until the balance reaches \$54,000 and maintained for the life of the loan.

## VIII. 2014 CAPITALIZATION GRANT EQUIVALENCIES

- 1) Green Project Reserve This project does not qualify for Green Project Reserve (GPR) funding.
- 2) Additional Subsidization This project qualifies for additional subsidization in the amount of \$488,225.

## IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS (See Exhibit 1)

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2012 through 2014. Amounts for 2015 are estimated. The Commission reports water, gas and sewer services in a combined statement. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

## **HISTORY**

Operating revenues increased 11% from 2012 to 2014 from \$7.4 million to \$8.2 million. Sewer revenues increase 15% from \$1.1 million to \$1.2 million during the same period. Operating expenses increased 9% from \$5.8 million to \$6.4 million. The increase is due to higher gas purchases along with increases in personnel costs. The debt coverage ratio remained consistent from 0.9 in 2012 to 0.9 in 2014.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 1.2, a debt to equity ratio of 0.8 and unrestricted cash equals 1.2 months of operating expenses.

### **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Water revenues reflect all previously approved rate increases as well as a 3% annual inflation increase due to a CPI clause.
- 2) Sewer revenues will be adjusted by an amount to increase revenues by \$80,000 or 6% by July 1, 2017 and will remain flat thereafter.
- 3) Gas revenues will remain flat.
- 4) Operating expenses will increase by 2% per year.
- 5) Debt service coverage is 1.0 in 2018 when full year principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the proforma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

### REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The annual replacement cost is \$4,900. This amount should be added to the replacement account each December 1 until the balance reaches \$49,000 and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR AN INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (B16-006) OF \$350,000 TO THE PERRY COUNTY FISCAL COURT, PERRY COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Infrastructure Revolving Loan Program with the Perry County Fiscal Court, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority intends to utilize money in the Infrastructure Revolving Fund to make the loan to the governmental agency for the aforementioned purposes; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Infrastructure Revolving Fund loans.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

Section 2. The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Infrastructure Revolving Fund Ioan commitment for \$350,000 of project expense, to the Perry County Fiscal Court for the Vicco Water System Emergency Repair project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Authority staff based on adjustment in project costs of not more than

(10%) ten percent of the project cost authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of 14% not to exceed \$50,000 will be deducted from the approved loan amount. The unforgiven principal balance of \$300,000 shall be repaid.

Section 4. The loan shall be repayable in 20 years at an annual interest rate of 0.75%. In addition to debt service, a 0.2% annual administration fee on the unpaid, principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$900 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$9,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 5th day of November, 2015.

## VIII. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS (See Exhibit 1)

This is a new utility and there is no financial history. Audited financial statements will be required annually once the District enters into an Assistance Agreement with KIA. The Fiscal Court acquired Vicco's water and wastewater systems, where the city of Vicco had not performed an audit in many years. The most recent unaudited financial statements provided were 2011. KIA reviewed those as a reference while compiling the financial forecast.

### **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Revenues will remain flat for growth.
- 2) Expenses will increase 2% annually for inflation.
- 3) Once all repairs have been completed, there will be a 30% reduction in annual expenses.

Based on the proforma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund B loan.

## REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The annual replacement cost is \$900. This amount should be added to the replacement account each December 1 until the balance reaches \$9,000 and maintained for the life of the loan.

Dear Mr. Scott:

As you may be aware the Perry County Fiscal Court accepted the transfer and took responsibility of all assets and liabilities of the Vicco Water System in March of this year. The system was in the middle of a legal action from the Knott County Water and Sewer District due to non-payment of past water purchases. In order to protect county citizens, this action was determined to be necessary.

Since that time we have been working to strengthen the systems' integrity, pay off past debt, and stabilize the financial position of the water and sewer systems. We had an initial analysis of the system's water distribution components and identified many instances of poor, inadequate repairs; lines on top of the ground; improperly placed meter bases and other issues that cause the water loss rate to go from 23%-25% in summer months to a high of between 55%-60% during the winter months. Since all water for the system is purchased, this level of water loss causes a severe financial strain on our customers.

We have submitted a KIA Fund B request to address the emergency repairs needed in order to reduce water loss during winter months to manageable levels. We understand that the financial records of the water system are not as strong as we would like in order to be able to meet the required KIA debt service payments on a monthly basis. In order to provide assurance to the KIA Board of Directors, Perry County Fiscal Court will make the necessary debt service payment(s) during any months that the water system is unable to generate sufficient revenues to make the required payment.

On behalf of the Fiscal Court, please accept this letter as our assurance to KIA, that the Perry County Fiscal Court will make any required KIA debt service payments when the water system revenues are not adequate to make such payments. If you have questions or need additional information, feel free to contact me.

Thank you, the Board of Directors and all the KIA staff for your assistance with this difficult, but much needed project.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F16-002) OF \$1,720,500 TO THE CUMBERLAND FALLS HIGHWAY WATER DISTRICT, WHITLEY COUNTY, KENTUCKY

**WHEREAS**, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

**WHEREAS,** pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund F) with the Cumberland Falls Highway Water District, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of its Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund F loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund loan for \$1,720,500 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the Cumberland Falls Highway Water District for the CFHWD- Line Replacement and Reinforcement project. Such amounts are

subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Authority staff at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the project cost authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of 25% will be deducted from the approved loan amount. The unforgiven principal balance of \$1,290,375 shall be repaid.

Section 4. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 0.75%. In addition to debt service, a 0.25% annual administration fee on the unpaid, unforgiven principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$4,300 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$43,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 5th day of November, 2015.

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended December 31, 2012 through 2014. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

### **HISTORY**

Revenues increased 3% from \$1.57 million in 2012 to \$1.63 million in 2014 due to a previously approved rate increase. Operating expenses decreased 7% from \$805,876 in 2012 to \$754,469 in 2014 as result of a decrease in District staff. The debt coverage ratio was 1.2, 2.0 and 1.8 for 2012, 2013 and 2014, respectively. The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 17.0, a debt to equity ratio of 0.6 and the number of months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash is 3.9.

### **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Revenues will increase approximately 11% in 2015 and 2016 to account for the 22% rate increase effective March 22, 2015, and will remain flat thereafter.
- 2) Operating expenses will increase 2% annually for inflation.

3) Debt coverage ratio will be 2.7 in 2017 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the proforma assumptions, the District shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund F loan.

**WHEREAS,** pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund F) with the Western Pulaski County Water District, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of its Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund F loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund loan for \$3,304,000 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the Western Pulaski County Water District for the Water System Improvements and Replacements project. Such amounts are

subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Authority staff at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the project cost authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 1.75%. In addition to debt service, a 0.25% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$8,300 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$83,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 5th day of November, 2015.

#### I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Western Pulaski County Water District is requesting a Fund "F" loan in the amount of \$3,304,000 for the Water System Improvements and Replacement project. The project consists of approximately 1,800 LF of 3 inch water line replacement and 650 LF 3 inch water line extensions; 8,200 LF of 4 inch water line replacement; 21,000 LF of 6 inch water line replacement and 1,800 LF of 6 inch water line relocation; and 7,500 LF of new 12 inch water transmission main. The project also includes the installation of a 300,000 gallon elevated water storage tank to replace an existing 100,000 gallon ground storage tank, as well as the renovation of an existing 300,000 gallon water storage tank. Lastly, the project will include the installation of two new pressure reducing stations and one hundred radio read meter systems.

This project will provide major improvements to the District's water distribution system, eliminate several dilapidated /undersized water lines, provide additional water storage by replacing an undersized water storage tank, and provide pressure reduction to areas experiencing high pressures. The project will also improve the quality of water by renovating an existing water storage tank that is experiencing large scale paint loss on both the interior and exterior surfaces. Additionally, there are certain structural and safety components which will require repair in order to ensure continued operation.

The District purchases water from the City of Somerset and the City of Russell Springs. Counties directly serviceable by the District include Casey, Pulaski, Russell and Wayne. The Public Service Commission has jurisdiction over this project.

#### IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS (See Exhibit 1)

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended December 31, 2012 through 2014. Percentages referenced in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

#### **HISTORY**

Revenues increased 14% from \$2.5 million in 2012 to \$2.9 million in 2014 due to a previously approved rate increase. Operating expenses increased 10% from \$829,842 in 2012 to \$926,395 in 2014. The debt coverage ratio was 1.7, 2.9 and 2.6 for 2012, 2013 and 2014, respectively. The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 3.1, a debt to equity ratio of 0.7 and the number of months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash is 6.1.

#### **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

1) Revenues will increase approximately 1.9% in 2015 to account for the 3.8% rate increase effective June 2, 2014 and will remain flat thereafter.

- 2) Proposed rate increase was not factored since the District has not yet received PSC approval.
- 3) Operating expenses will increase 2% annually for inflation.
- 4) Debt coverage ratio will be 1.7 in 2017 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the proforma assumptions, the District shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund F loan.

#### REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The annual replacement cost is \$8,300. This amount should be added to the replacement account each December 1 until the balance reaches \$83,000 and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has heretofore approved the undertaking of the projects described in further detail in <a href="Exhibit A">Exhibit A</a> (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates making loans to governmental agencies pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act") for the Project and the governmental agencies may be expected to pay and/or incur costs with respect to the Project ("Prior Capital Expenditures") on or after the date of this resolution and prior to the issuance of the obligations (the "Obligations") which will finance the Project.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority as follows:

**Section 1.** The Board of Directors hereby approves the use of the Obligations to finance the costs of the Project in the maximum principal amount set forth in Exhibit A plus costs of issuance related thereto and amounts required to fund a debt service reserve, if any, and declares its intent that any Prior Capital Expenditures made by the governmental agencies pursuant to loans made by the Authority will be made in anticipation of the issuance of such Obligations to reimburse said Prior Capital Expenditures. This declaration is made pursuant to Treas. Reg. §1.150-2.

**Section 2.** The Executive Director and Treasurer of the Authority are hereby authorized and directed to reimburse, not later than eighteen months after the later of (i) the date of the expenditure or (ii) the date the item was placed in service, but in any event not later than three years after the original expenditure, only those Prior Capital Expenditures made with respect to assets having a reasonably expected economic life of at least one year, and in addition, eligible preliminary expenditures paid and incurred prior to commencement of the Project.

**Section 3.** The Authority finds and determines that, consistent with the Authority's budgetary and financial circumstances, it does not have funds currently available and does not expect to have funds available in the future that may be allocated on a long-term basis, other than the proceeds of the Obligations, to finance the Prior Capital Expenditures.

**Section 4.** The Authority hereby directs the Executive Director, Secretary, and Treasurer to take the following action at the time the Prior Capital Expenditures are reimbursed from proceeds of the Obligations: (i) evidence the reimbursement on the books and records maintained with respect to the Obligations, and (ii) identify either the actual prior expenditure to be reimbursed or, in the case of reimbursement of a fund or account, the fund or account from which the expenditure was paid.

**Section 5.** The books, records and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution shall be made reasonably available by the Authority for its inspection by the general public at the Authority's administrative office every business day during normal business hours commencing no later than 30 days after the passage of this resolution. Said books, record and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution will continue to be reasonably available to the general public until the date of issuance of the Obligations.

**Section 6.** This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption.
