## **PROCEEDINGS**

Chairman Tony Wilder called the meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) Board to order. Commissioner Wilder confirmed that a quorum was present and that the press had been notified regarding the meeting. The Commissioner asked board members and guests to introduce themselves.

## I. BUSINESS (Board Action Required)

## **APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

For: KIA Regular Board Meeting of November 5, 2015

Mr. Jeff DeRouen moved to approve the Minutes of the November 5, 2015, regular board meeting. Ms. Linda Bridwell seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

## B. NEW PROJECTS/ACTION ITEMS

1. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A16-033) IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1,566,370 TO THE CITY OF HARRODSBURG, MERCER COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Ms. Jami Johnson, KIA, discussed the City of Harrodsburg's request for Fund "A" loan in the amount of \$1,566,370 for the Sewer Rehabilitation 2015 project. This project was originally two projects that have been combined into one loan. The first portion of the project will include cleaning, and video inspection of approximately 21,500 linear feet (LF) of the sanitary sewer collector lines, rehabilitation of 12,500 LF of sewer line as well as repair of 30 manholes. The second portion of the project will include replacing and relocating approximately 831 LF of 8 inch PVC pipe.

This project will achieve energy efficiency by reducing electricity costs through the decline of wastewater pumped to the equalization basins. This process will reduce pumping times and aeration.

The City's wastewater system has about 2,800 customers and also treats wastewater for the Mercer County Sanitation District.

Ms. Linda Bridwell made the motion to amend the Fund A loan (A16-033) in the amount of \$1,566,370 to the City of Harrodsburg with the

standard conditions. Ms. Lona Brewer seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

2. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A16-064) IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1,300,000 TO THE CITY OF MOREHEAD FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE MOREHEAD UTILITY PLANT BOARD, ROWAN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Ms. Debbie Landrum, KIA, discussed the City of Morehead for the benefit of the Morehead Utility Plant Board's request for a Fund "A" loan in the amount of \$1,300,000 for the Sunnybrook Development Sewer Line Extension project. The project will provide new sanitary sewer services to 100 unserved households. The project will install nearly 12,000 linear feet (LF) of 8 inch PVC lines, construct a lift station and install 45 manholes.

The added infrastructure to the Sunnybrook Development on state road US-60 will allow the implementation of 100 future jobs within the City.

The Morehead Utility Plant Board serves portions of Rowan, Bath and Fleming Counties and has approximately 6,259 sewer customers.

Ms. Linda Bridwell made the motion to approve the Fund A loan (A16-064) in the amount of \$1,300,000 to the City of Morehead for the benefit of the Morehead Utility Plant Board with the standard conditions. Mr. Ron Lovan seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

3. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A16-065) IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1,800,000 TO THE CITY OF MOREHEAD FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE MOREHEAD UTILITY PLANT BOARD, ROWAN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Ms. Debbie Landrum, KIA, discussed the City of Morehead for the Benefit of the Morehead Utility Plant Board's request for Fund "A" loan in the amount of 1,800,000 for the KY-801 and KY-158 Sewer Extension project. The project will provide sanitary sewer service to 55 unserved households in the KY-801 and KY-158 area within the City of Sharkey. The project will install nearly 6,100 linear feet (LF) of 8 inch gravity

PVC lines and 6,500 LF of 3 inch force main PVC lines. An additional 24,000 LF of 1.5 to 3 inch PVC force main lines will be installed off KY-158 as well as instillation of 33 grinder pumps and 38 manholes.

The Morehead Utility Plant Board serves portions of Rowan, Bath and Fleming Counties and has approximately 6,259 sewer customers.

Mr. Linda Bridwell made the motion to approve the Fund A loan (A16-065) in the amount of \$1,800,000 with the standard conditions. Mr. Ron Lovan seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

4. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A16-011) IN THE AMOUNT OF \$235,000 TO THE SOUTHERN WATER & SEWER DISTRICT, FLOYD COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Ms. Sarah Aitken, KIA, discussed the Southern Water and Sewer District's request for a Fund "A" loan in the amount of \$235,000 for the Harold Sewer- Phase III project. The project includes expansion of the recently constructed wastewater treatment and collection system in the Betsy Layne area of southern Floyd County. Extension of pressure sewer service to additional areas that include Store Hollow, Lower Hollow and Velocity Bottom of Betsy Layne will provide new service and add flow to the current wastewater system. The project consists of a combination of 1.25, 2, 3 and 10 inch sewer pipe, encasements where required, gate valves and grinder pump stations for customers. In addition, a lift station and associated equipment are included in the project.

The District supplies sewer services to a population of 372 within Floyd County.

Mr. Jeff DeRouen recused himself from voting. Mr. Paul Lashbrooke made the motion to approve the Fund F loan (A16-011) in the amount of \$235,000 to the Southern Water & Sewer District with the standard conditions. Mr. Ron Lovan seconded and the motion unanimously carried.

5. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AMENDMENT OF THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F15-002) INCREASING THE AMOUNT TO \$15,564,332 TO THE MONROE COUNTY WATER DISTRICT, MONROE COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW and Ms. Brandi Norton, KIA discussed the Monroe County Water District's ("District") request for an increase of \$3,550,694 to a previously approved \$12,013,638 Fund "F" loan for the Regional Water Treatment Plant and System Improvements Project. The project was presented in July 2015 and was competitively bid in three contracts. The lowest bid exceeded the engineer's estimate by \$3,865,694.

The project will construct a new raw water intake on the Cumberland River, a 600,000 gallon water storage tank, one pump station, transmission lines and a two million gallon per day water treatment plant. Plans and specifications for the water treatment plant are substantially complete and were grant funded as a component of other water system improvements projects. The final plant design will permit a one million gallon per day expansion if demand increases. The District has secured a water withdrawal permit through the Division of Water (DOW) and the Army Corps of Engineers. The project ranked second out of sixty-seven projects by the DOW for the 2015 funding cycle and has consistently ranked high in previous funding cycles.

The District purchases about 275 million gallons of water per year from the City of Tompkinsville ("the "City") to support 3,400 customers and is subject to Public Service Commission jurisdiction. The City sources water from Mill Creek Lake and has frequently been unable to provide required water demand during peak or drought periods. Additionally, the City has been subject to periodic Notices of Violation (NOV) from the Division of Water. Upgrades to the City's water treatment plant would not remedy the ongoing supply constraint. The District has made numerous attempts over several years to partner with the City on a regional solution to jointly address these issues but has been unsuccessful.

The District also serves residents of the City of Gamaliel and provides an emergency connection to the Fountain Run Water District #1.

Mr. Jeff DeRouen recused himself from voting. Ms. Linda Bridwell made the motion to approve the increase to Fund F loan (F15-002) in the amount of \$15,564,332 to the Monroe County District with the standard conditions. Ms. Lona Brewer seconded and the motion unanimously carried.

6. A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

### **BRIEF DESCRIPTION**

A16-026: This project will reconstruct and upgrade the Ravine Interceptor Sewer that conveys combined sewage to the north portion of the Owensboro sewer system. The condition of the current line is unstable as has various structural issues due to improper pipe sizing during instillation. The existing line crosses several city blocks that do not have dedicated easements, which is problematic during repair efforts. The project will separate storm water and waste water into separate pipes conveying the storm water out of the combined sewer system.

A16-042: This project will provide sanitary sewer service to 48 households within the Pleasant View Subdivison. The project will include extension of sewer lines to the unserved homes and the elimination of septic systems. The project will aid in clearing up water in the area and eliminating further environmental concerns.

A16-043: This project will provide sanitary sewer service to 70 households within the Woodland's Subdivison. The project will include extension of sewer lines to the unserved homes and the elimination of septic systems. The project will aid in clearing up water in the area and eliminating further environmental concerns.

RWRA revenue is derived 100% from its ratepayers who reside in areas of Daviess County inside and outside of the city limits.

RWRA is a regionalization model for other counties in Kentucky and nationally. The Wastewater Treatment Plant was highlighted in EPA's 2004 Annual Report on the Clean Water State Revolving Fund Programs.

Revenues increased 23% from \$14.4 million in 2013 to \$17.7 million in 2015 while operating expenses increased 14% from \$11.1 million to \$12.7 million during the same period. Cash available for debt service was \$4.7, 5.9, and 7.1 million for 2013, 2014 and 2015, respectively while the debt coverage ratio was 1.7, 2.0 and 2.5.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 7.7 and a debt to equity ratio of 0.9. In 2011 RWRA used existing cash reserves to extinguish a higher rate (3.8%) KIA loan. As a part of existing KIA loan agreements \$2,500,000 continues to be held as a designated renewal and replacement reserve.

## **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Revenues reflect previously approved rate increases and growth of 1.5% annually.
- 2) Expenses will increase 3% annually.
- 3) Total debt service will average about \$4 million in from 2015 through 2020 based on outstanding and proposed loans.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 2.1 in 2019 when principal and interest repayments begin for all KIA funded projects that are proposed or in process.

Based on the proforma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

#### **HISTORY**

Revenues increased 23% from \$14.4 million in 2013 to \$17.7 million in 2015 while operating expenses increased 14% from \$11.1 million to \$12.7 million during the same period. Cash available for debt service was \$4.7, 5.9, and 7.1 million for 2013, 2014 and 2015, respectively while the debt coverage ratio was 1.7, 2.0 and 2.5.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 7.7 and a debt to equity ratio of 0.9. In 2011 RWRA used existing cash reserves to extinguish a higher rate (3.8%) KIA loan. As a part of existing KIA loan agreements \$2,500,000 continues to be held as a designated renewal and replacement reserve.

#### **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Revenues reflect previously approved rate increases and growth of 1.5% annually.
- 2) Expenses will increase 3% annually.
- 3) Total debt service will average about \$4 million in from 2015 through 2020 based on outstanding and proposed loans.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 2.1 in 2019 when principal and interest repayments begin for all KIA funded projects that are proposed or in process.

Based on the proforma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

#### REPLACEMENT RESERVE

\$2,500,000 has been deposited into the Replacement Reserve Account and will be maintained for the life of all RWRA loans. No additional reserve will be required as a result of this loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A16-043) IN THE AMOUNT OF \$485,000 TO THE REGIONAL WATER RESOURCE AGENCY GOVERNMENT, DAVIESS COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund A loan for \$485,000 of project expense including

capitalized interest for the construction period, to the Regional Water Resource Agency Government for the Woodlands South Sewer Extension Project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Authority staff at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the project cost authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 1.75%. In addition to debt service, a 0.2% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. There is no annual reserve requirement. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Revenues reflect previously approved rate increases and growth of 1.5% annually.
- 2) Expenses will increase 3% annually.
- 3) Total debt service will average about \$4 million in from 2015 through 2020 based on outstanding and proposed loans.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 2.1 in 2019 when principal and interest repayments begin for all KIA funded projects that are proposed or in process.

Based on the proforma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

#### REPLACEMENT RESERVE

\$2,500,000 has been deposited into the Replacement Reserve Account and will be maintained for the life of all RWRA loans. No additional reserve will be required as a result of this loan.

#### IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2013 through 2015. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

#### **HISTORY**

Revenues decreased 1% from \$6.97 million in 2013 to \$6.92 million in 2015 due to reduced customer water consumption. Operating expenses increased 1% from \$3.88 million in 2013 to \$3.92 million in 2015 due to a heightened cost of power during the 2014-15 fiscal year, depreciation expense and the interest cost to fund capital projects. The debt coverage ratio was 2.4, 2.1 and 1.9 for 2013, 2014 and 2015, respectively. The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 6.2, a debt to equity ratio of 0.5 and the number of months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash is 17.1.

#### **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Revenues will increase approximately 11% in calendar year 2016 and 5.3% in calendar year 2017 to account for the 16.3% rate increase effective March 3, 2016, and will remain flat thereafter.
- 2) Operating expenses will increase 2% annually for inflation.
- 3) Debt service coverage is 2.9 in 2018 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the proforma assumptions, the Utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

#### REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The agency currently has designated reserves which include (1) restricted reserves related to outstanding debt and (2) reserves established by the agency for high dollar capital equipment purchases, emergencies and rate stabilization (currently funded to the maximum level of \$3,000,000). In the case of the second reserve account, the agency has a policy that this account cannot drop below \$750,000 and anytime the balance is less than \$3,000,000 their policy states that they will deposit \$135,000 annually until the maximum balance is obtained.

### VIII. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS (See Exhibit 1)

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended December 30, 2012 through 2014. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

### **HISTORY**

Revenues decreased 1% from \$451,961 in 2012 to \$449,201 in 2014. Purchased water expense increased 10%. Operating expenses increased 6% from \$278,314 in 2012 to \$295,978 in 2014. The debt coverage ratio was 0.5, -0.4 and -0.4, respectively, for 2012 through 2014.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 4.9 and a debt to equity ratio of 1.0. The number of months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash was 3.5.

### **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

1) Revenues reflect the following previously approved rate increases and will remain flat thereafter:

August 1, 2014 10.7% March 30, 2015 22.5% August 1, 2015 .9%

- 2) Purchased water cost will increase 2% per year for inflation.
- 3) Operating expenses will increase 2% per year for inflation.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 1.7 in 2016 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the proforma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund B loan.

### REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The annual replacement cost is \$1,000. This amount should be added to the replacement account each December 1 until the balance reaches \$10,000 and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PROGRAM FUND C LOAN (C95-04) IN THE AMOUNT OF \$47,500 TO THE MCLEAN COUNTY REGIONAL WATER COMMISSION, MCLEAN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

**WHEREAS**, The Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Governmental Agencies Program (Fund C) with the Mclean County Regional Water Commission for a the assumption of the City of Calhoun's C95-04 remaining debt, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined: and

WHEREAS, the Authority may, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of its Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority may, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of its Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bond Anticipation Notes ("Notes") for the purpose of funding construction loans to various governmental agencies until Revenue Bonds are sold to provide permanent financing, such series of Notes to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bond Anticipation Notes with the appropriate Series designation.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes issuance of Governmental Agencies Program Fund C conditional loan commitment to the Mclean County Regional Water Commission for the assumption of the City of Calhoun's remaining debt on loan C95-04. The

cost of the project shall not exceed \$47,500 of which the Authority loan shall provide up to \$47,500.

<u>Section 3.</u> Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the above loan commitment, the Authority hereby authorizes execution of an assistance agreement by and between the Authority and the Mclean County Regional Water Commission. The cost of said project to be provided by this loan shall not exceed \$47,500. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Authority staff based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the project cost authorized by this resolution and are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be reduced by action of the Authority staff at the time of the issuance of bonds based on reductions in project costs or financing costs.

Section 4. Upon execution of an assistance agreement, and in anticipation of the issuance of bonds by the Authority for the project, the Authority hereby authorizes interim advances to the Mclean County Regional Water Commission, from the proceeds of the Authority's Notes in an amount not to exceed the loan amount. Such interim advances shall bear interest at the rate or rates established for the Notes or other source of funding, or from other funds available to the Authority for such purposes, until repaid from either borrower revenues or the proceeds of the Assistance Agreement upon the issuance of bonds. Such interim interest charges shall be payable each June 1 and December 1, following the initial advance unless the borrower elects to include such costs in the principal amount of the loan.

<u>Section 5.</u> At such time as the Authority's Bonds are issued, there shall be retired from the proceeds of the Authority's Bonds such Notes as have been issued pursuant to the provisions of this Resolution and Order.

<u>Section 6.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 4h day of February, 2016.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F16-027) OF \$4,000,000 TO THE NORTHERN KENTUCKY WATER DISTRICT GOVERNMENT, KENTON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund F) with the Northern Kentucky Water District, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of its Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund F loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund loan for \$4,000,000 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the Northern Kentucky Water District for the Campbell and Kenton County Water Main Replacement and SCADA project. Such

amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Authority staff at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the project cost authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 1.75%. In addition to debt service, a 0.25% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$10,000 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$100,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 4th day of February, 2016.

### I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Northern Kentucky Water District is requesting a Fund "F" loan in the amount of \$4,000,000 for the Campbell and Kenton County Water Main Replacement and SCADA Improvements project. The project will replace three water mains on four streets, replace a 36 inch cross country transmission main with a 24 inch main, and include SCADA improvements on approximately 40 sites. The water main replacements were broken down into multiple phases and contracts to mitigate the risk of delays in project completion. The project phases are listed below.

### **Project Summaries**

Phase 1- Buttermilk Pike water main replacement includes replacement of approximately 2,775 linear feet (LF) of 6 inch main with 8 inch main on 2 streets in Kenton County.

Phase 2- 36 inch Concrete Water Main Replacement for 2,250 LF of 36 inch transmission main with new 24 inch cross- county main in Kenton County.

Phase 3- Ann Street and Putnam Street Water Main Replacement will replace 2,160 LF of 4 inch main with 8 inch main on Ann Street and 1,090 LF on Putnam Street in Campbell County.

Phase 4- SCADA Improvements in Campbell and Kenton Counties which will replace equipment for security and remote operation of the distribution system including programmable logic controllers, radio equipment and sensors, and water quality analyzers for approximately 40 sites with tanks, pump stations or meter and regulator valves.

The District provides service to Campbell and Kenton counties and portions of Boone, Grant and Pendleton counties and is regulated by the Public Service Commission. Wholesale service is provided to the City of Walton and the Bullock Pen and Pendleton County Water Districts.

### IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS (See Exhibit 1)

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended December 30, 2012 through 2014. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

### HISTORY

Revenues increased 4% from \$49.0 million in 2012 to \$50.9 million in 2014 with rate increases being offset by some volume decline. Operating expenses averaged \$24.3 million each year during the same period. The debt coverage ratio was consistent at 1.6, 1.6, and 1.4 for 2012, 2013 and 2014, respectively.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 2.4 and a debt to equity ratio of 1.3. The number of months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash is 9.8. The District maintains various restricted accounts, primarily related to its bond covenants, and an Improvement, Repair and Replacement Reserve account. This account had a balance of \$3.2 million or .71% of in service fixed assets, at the end of 2014.

### **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Revenues will increase approximately 3% annually for inflation and an additional 5% in 2016 due to a previously approved rate increase.
- 2) Expenses will increase approximately 3% for inflation.
- 3) Debt service coverage is 1.6 in 2018 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the proforma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund F loan.

### REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The annual replacement cost is \$10,000. This amount should be added to the replacement account each December 1 until the balance reaches \$100,000 and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has heretofore approved the undertaking of the projects described in further detail in <a href="Exhibit A">Exhibit A</a> (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates making loans to governmental agencies pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act") for the Project and the governmental agencies may be expected to pay and/or incur costs with respect to the Project ("Prior Capital Expenditures") on or after the date of this resolution and prior to the issuance of the obligations (the "Obligations") which will finance the Project.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority as follows:

**Section 1.** The Board of Directors hereby approves the use of the Obligations to finance the costs of the Project in the maximum principal amount set forth in Exhibit A plus costs of issuance related thereto and amounts required to fund a debt service reserve, if any, and declares its intent that any Prior Capital Expenditures made by the governmental agencies pursuant to loans made by the Authority will be made in anticipation of the issuance of such Obligations to reimburse said Prior Capital Expenditures. This declaration is made pursuant to Treas. Reg. §1.150-2.

**Section 2.** The Executive Director and Treasurer of the Authority are hereby authorized and directed to reimburse, not later than eighteen months after the later of (i) the date of the expenditure or (ii) the date the item was placed in service, but in any event not later than three years after the original expenditure, only those Prior Capital Expenditures made with respect to assets having a reasonably expected economic life of at least one year, and in addition, eligible preliminary expenditures paid and incurred prior to commencement of the Project.

**Section 3.** The Authority finds and determines that, consistent with the Authority's budgetary and financial circumstances, it does not have funds currently available and does not expect to have funds available in the future that may be allocated on a long-term basis, other than the proceeds of the Obligations, to finance the Prior Capital Expenditures.

**Section 4.** The Authority hereby directs the Executive Director, Secretary, and Treasurer to take the following action at the time the Prior Capital Expenditures are reimbursed from proceeds of the Obligations: (i) evidence the reimbursement on the books and records maintained with respect to the Obligations, and (ii) identify either the actual prior expenditure to be reimbursed or, in the case of reimbursement of a fund or account, the fund or account from which the expenditure was paid.

**Section 5.** The books, records and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution shall be made reasonably available by the Authority for its inspection by the general public at the Authority's administrative office every business day during normal business hours commencing no later than 30 days after the passage of this resolution. Said books, record and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution will continue to be reasonably available to the general public until the date of issuance of the Obligations.

**Section 6.** This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption.

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### PRELIMINARY BOND RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION (THE PRELIMINARY BOND RESOLUTION) OF THE KENTUCKY OF THE INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY (AUTHORITY) AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF A SERIES TRUST INDENTURE BY AND BETWEEN THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AND U.S. BANK NATIONAL ASSOCIATION, LOUISVILLE, KENTUCKY; PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY WASTEWATER AND DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND PROGRAM REVENUE REFUNDING BONDS, SERIES 2016A IN AN AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$110,000,000 UNDER THE TERMS OF A SERIES TRUST INDENTURE AND THE GENERAL TRUST INDENTURE DATED AS OF MARCH 1, 2010 BETWEEN THE AUTHORITY AND U.S. BANK NATIONAL ASSOCIATION: AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF AN ESCROW TRUST AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE AUTHORITY AND U.S. BANK NATIONAL ASSOCIATION; PROVIDING FOR THE PAYMENT OF THE PRINCIPAL OF AND INTEREST ON SAID BONDS; AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF SAID BONDS; AND REPEALING ALL RESOLUTIONS OR PARTS THEREOF IN CONFLICT WITH THE PROVISIONS HEREOF.

WHEREAS, the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, being the duly and legally constituted legislature of Kentucky, at its 1988 Regular Session, enacted House Bill 217 amending Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"), creating the "Kentucky Infrastructure Authority" (the "Authority") to serve the public purposes identified in the Act; and

WHEREAS, Title VI of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, as amended by the Water Quality Act of 1987 (collectively, the "Wastewater Act") authorizes the United States Environmental Protection Agency (the "EPA") to award grants to qualifying states to establish and capitalize state water pollution control revolving funds for the purpose of providing loans and certain other forms of financial assistance to finance, among other things, the construction of publicly-owned wastewater treatment facilities, estuary conservation management plans and the implementation of nonpoint source management programs (the "Wastewater Program"); and

WHEREAS, the General Assembly, pursuant to Chapter 437 of the Acts of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, 1988 Regular Session, authorized the establishment and financing of a wastewater revolving fund, as described in Section 224A.111 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Wastewater Revolving Fund"), to be administered by the Authority, in order to carry out the public purposes of the Act and the Wastewater Act; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 6A of the Public Health Service Act, as amended (the "Drinking Water Act," and together with the Wastewater Act, the "Federal Acts") authorizes EPA to award grants to qualifying states to establish and capitalize state revolving funds from which a state can provide loans and certain other forms of financial assistance to finance drinking water system improvements (the "Drinking Water Program," and together with the Wastewater Program, the "Programs"); and

WHEREAS, the General Assembly, pursuant to Chapter 373 of the Acts of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, 1994 Regular Session, amended the Act and authorized the establishment and financing of a water supply revolving fund, as described in Section 224A.1115 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Drinking Water Revolving Fund," and together with the Wastewater Revolving Fund, the "Revolving Funds"), to be administered by the Authority, in order to carry out the public purposes of the Act and the Drinking Water Act; and

WHEREAS, the Act provides that the Authority may issue revenue bonds or notes for the purpose of providing funds and moneys to the Authority to enable it to enter into Assistance Agreements (as hereinafter defined) with borrowers qualified under the Act and the Federal Acts to acquire and lease capital projects eligible for financing under the Act and the Federal Acts (collectively, the "Projects") to Borrowers, to purchase or refinance obligations of Borrowers

issued for Projects, to make loans or grants for Projects, and to enable the Authority generally to carry out and effectuate its proper corporate purposes.

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Federal Acts, obligations issued to finance Assistance Agreements with Borrowers under the Wastewater Program are to be payable primarily from the assets of the Wastewater Program and obligations issued to finance Assistance Agreements with Borrowers under the Drinking Water Program are to be payable primarily from the assets of the Drinking Water Program; provided however that upon satisfaction of certain conditions set forth in the Federal Acts, and the regulations promulgated pursuant thereto, financing for the Programs on a consolidated basis may be undertaken and provisions may be made for cross-collateralization and the transfer of assets between the Wastewater Program and the Drinking Water Program; and

WHEREAS, in furtherance of the foregoing, and in compliance with the Act, the Authority heretofore entered into a General Trust Indenture dated as of March 1, 2010 (the "General Trust Indenture") with U.S. Bank National Association, Louisville, Kentucky (the "Trustee") to provide for (a) the issuance from time to time of revenue bonds of the Authority (the "Wastewater and Drinking Water Revolving Fund Program Bonds") to finance and refinance Projects, (b) the security in respect of the Wastewater and Drinking Water Revolving Fund Program Bonds, (c) protecting and enforcing rights and remedies of the holders of the Wastewater and Drinking Water Revolving Fund Program Bonds, (d) the custody, safeguarding, and application of all Authority revenues pledged for the payment of the Wastewater and Drinking Water Revolving Fund Program Bonds, (e) the duties and responsibilities of the trustee named thereunder, and (f) inter alia, all other necessary and desirable provisions with respect to the

Wastewater and Drinking Water Revolving Fund Program Bonds, including covenants of the Authority with regard thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority has determined that, pursuant to the provisions of this Preliminary Bond Resolution, the General Trust Indenture and a certain series trust indenture between the Authority and the Trustee to be dated the first day of the month in which the Series 2016A Bonds (as hereinafter defined) are issued and delivered (the "Series 2016A Trust Indenture"), it is necessary and desirable at this time to provide for the issuance by the Authority of a series of Senior Bonds (as defined in the General Trust Indenture) constituting Wastewater and Drinking Water Revolving Fund Program Bonds, which Senior Bonds are to be designated as "Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Wastewater and Drinking Water Revolving Fund Program Revenue Refunding Bonds, Series 2016A" (the "Series 2016A Bonds"), in order to provide moneys to (i) (ii) refund in advance of maturity all or a portion of the currently outstanding Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Wastewater and Drinking Water Revolving Fund Program Revenue Bonds, Series 2010A (the "Prior 2010 Bonds") and Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Wastewater and Drinking Water Revolving Fund Program Revenue Bonds, Series 2012A (the "Prior 2012 Bonds," and together with the Prior 2010 Bonds, the "Prior Bonds"), all as permitted by the Act; and

WHEREAS, the hereby readopts and affirms the General Trust Indenture attached hereto as  $\underline{\text{Exhibit A}}$  as if fully set forth herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. <u>Issuance of Bonds; Execution and Delivery of Series Indenture Authorized.</u>
There are hereby authorized Senior Bonds of the Authority to be designated as "Kentucky

Infrastructure Authority Wastewater and Drinking Water Revolving Fund Program Revenue Refunding Bonds, Series 2016A" (the "Series 2016A Bonds") in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$110,000,000. In connection with the issuance of the Series 2016A Bonds, the Chair and Secretary of the Authority be and they are hereby authorized to execute on behalf of the Authority the Series 2016A Trust Indenture with the Trustee governing the issuance of the Series 2016A Bonds, in substantially the same form as the document attached hereto as Exhibit B, with such changes therein not inconsistent with this Preliminary Bond Resolution or the General Trust Indenture and not substantially adverse to the Authority as may be permitted by the Act and approved by the officers executing the same on behalf of the Authority. The approval of such changes by said officers, and that such are not substantially adverse to the Authority, shall be conclusively evidenced by the execution of such Series 2016A Trust Indenture by such officers. The Series 2016A Trust Indenture, including the form of Series 2016A Bonds, is hereby incorporated by reference in this Preliminary Bond Resolution as fully as if copied in full herein. The Series 2016A Bonds shall mature and shall bear interest from their dated date at the rates set forth in the Series 2016A Trust Indenture.

Section 2. Effective Date of Series 2016A Trust Indenture. The Series 2016A Trust Indenture shall become effective upon the date of execution and delivery thereof by the Chair and Secretary of the Authority and the duly authorized officer of the Trustee.

Section 3. Execution and Delivery of Purchase Contract. The sale and delivery of the Series 2016A Bonds to Morgan Stanley & Co. LLC (the "Underwriter"), shall be undertaken upon the terms and conditions to be set forth in a purchase contract for the Series 2016A Bonds (the "Purchase Contract") with the Underwriter. The Executive Committee of the Authority (the "Executive Committee") is hereby authorized to approve the execution, delivery and

performance of the Purchase Contract for the Series 2016A Bonds authorized hereunder, subject to such changes, additions and deletions and at the interest rates as may be approved by the Executive Committee, and the officers of the Authority are hereby authorized, upon adoption of the resolution of the Executive Committee approving and authorizing the Purchase Contract and establishing the final principal amount of the Series 2016A Bonds, to execute and deliver the Purchase Contract to the Underwriter, which execution and delivery shall be conclusive evidence of the approval of the price, interest rates and any aforesaid changes, additions and deletions.

Section 4. Approval, Execution, Use and Distribution of the Official Statement. The staff of the Authority is hereby directed to prepare, with the assistance of the Underwriter a Preliminary Official Statement (the "Preliminary Official Statement") and Official Statement (the "Official Statement") for the Series 2016A Bonds, in the customary forms, which Preliminary Official Statement and Official Statement shall be approved by the Chair or his duly authorized representative prior to their distribution in connection with the sale of the Series 2016A Bonds. The Authority hereby authorizes the Chair or his duly authorized representative to make the determination at the applicable time that the Preliminary Official Statement is in final form in accordance with Securities and Exchange Commission Rule 15c2-12, as amended (the "Rule"). The officers of the Authority are hereby authorized to execute the Official Statement, in substantially the form as approved subsequently by the Chair or his or his duly authorized representative, subject to such changes, additions and deletions as may be approved by the Chair, or his duly authorized representative, which execution and delivery shall be conclusive evidence of the approval of any aforesaid changes, additions and deletions. The Authority shall provide a final Official Statement to the Underwriter within seven (7) business days of the date of sale of the Series 2016A Bonds in accordance with the Rule.

Section 5. Approval, Execution and Delivery of Continuing Disclosure Agreement. In order to enable the Underwriter to comply with the continuing disclosure requirements of the Rule, the Authority hereby covenants and agrees that in connection with the issuance of the Series 2016A Bonds it will execute, comply with and carry out all of the provisions of a continuing disclosure agreement for the Series 2016A Bonds between the Authority and the Trustee dated as of the first day of the month in which the Series 2016A Bonds are issued and delivered (the "Continuing Disclosure Agreement"). Failure to comply with any such provisions of the Continuing Disclosure Agreement shall not constitute a default on the Series 2016A Bonds; however, any holder of the Series 2016A Bonds, including any beneficial owner of the Series 2016A Bonds, may take such action as may be necessary and appropriate, including seeking specific performance, to cause the Authority to comply with its obligations under the applicable Continuing Disclosure Agreement. The Chair and Secretary be and they are hereby authorized to execute on behalf of the Authority the Continuing Disclosure Agreement, in substantially the same form as the document attached hereto as Exhibit C, which Continuing Disclosure Agreement is incorporated by reference in this Preliminary Bond Resolution as fully as if copied in full herein.

Section 6. Execution and Delivery of Escrow Trust Agreement. Following the sale and delivery of the Series 2016A Bonds, a portion of the proceeds thereof shall be deposited in escrow and applied in accordance with the escrow trust agreement to be dated as of the first day of the month in which the Series 2016A Bonds are to be issued and delivered (the "Escrow Trust Agreements") between the Authority and U.S. Bank National Association, Louisville, Kentucky, in substantially the same form as the documents attached hereto as Exhibit D. The Escrow Trust Agreement is incorporated by reference in this Preliminary Bond Resolution as fully as if copied

in full herein. The Chairman and Secretary be and they are hereby authorized to execute and deliver on behalf of the Authority the Escrow Trust Agreement, subject to such changes, additions and deletions as may be approved by the officers executing the same, such execution and delivery to be conclusive evidence of the approval of any such changes, additions and deletions.

Section 7. Conflicts Repealed. All provisions of the various resolutions passed and adopted by the Authority, to the extent, but only to the extent, the same conflict with the provisions of this Preliminary Bond Resolution, the General Trust Indenture and Series 2016A Trust Indenture are hereby repealed and the provisions of this Preliminary Bond Resolution and the General Trust Indenture and Series 2016A Trust Indenture shall govern all matters relating to the sale and issuance of said Series 2016A Bonds, the disbursement of the Series 2016A Bond proceeds, and the future application of the funds and accounts established in the General Trust Indenture.

Section 8. Severability. If any section, paragraph or provision of this Preliminary Bond Resolution shall be held to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, the invalidity or unenforceability of such section, paragraph or provision shall not affect any of the remaining provisions of this Preliminary Bond Resolution.

Section 9. Open Meetings. The Authority hereby finds and determines that all formal actions relative to the adoption of this Preliminary Bond Resolution were taken in an open meeting of the Authority, and that all deliberations of the Authority and of its committees, if any, which resulted in formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in full compliance with applicable legal requirements.
