

- (2) During a water shortage emergency, customers will be notified by phone and/or door tag of non-compliant activity. If after twenty-four (24) hours (one day) of notice the non-compliant activity continues, a non-compliance surcharge of seventy-five dollars (\$75.00) per occurrence will be assessed to the water customer.
- (3) Surcharges will be assessed to the customer's next water bill. Failure to pay in accordance with WMU billing/payment procedures will result in termination of service.
- (4) Water service will be terminated to any meter or service address where persistent violations of mandatory conservation requirements are observed.

**DIVISION 2. RATES AND BILLING\***

**Sec. 14-81. Rate schedules.**

(a) The following schedules of monthly rates, fees and charges for water, wastewater, solid waste and related utility services shall be paid by the owner or occupant of each and every residential, commercial, industrial or other establishment or property, building or structure of any kind connected with and served by the combined and consolidated system are established:

(b) The funds derived from the capital accumulation portion of user charges will be maintained in separate funds.

(c) Water, wastewater and solid waste utility rate schedules.

- (1) The Winchester Municipal Utilities Commission shall, in January of each year, review and consider adjustments to the user charge schedules for the water, wastewater, and solid waste utilities. Revisions shall be based upon the United States Department of Labor Consumer Price

Index (CPI) for the calendar year ending December 31 of the preceding year. Any adjustments to the water, wastewater and solid waste user charges shall be recorded in the Minutes of the Winchester Municipal Utilities Commission and shall state the basis of any adjustments to said user charges.

- (2) Adjustments to the water, wastewater, and solid waste user charges shall not be greater than three (3) percent in any one year. Adjustments in excess of three (3) percent in any one year shall require in addition to that of the municipal utilities commission the approval of the board of commissioners of the City of Winchester.
- (3) The adjustments to the water, wastewater, and solid waste user charges shall be legally advertised one (1) time in the Winchester Sun or other publication in which legal publications for the city are made and which shall become automatically effective July 1, of 2008 and March 1 of each succeeding year in which the findings are made. The decision of the municipal utilities commission shall carry full force of ordinance as if considered and ordained by the board of commissioners of the city. The municipal utilities shall notify the city clerk of such changes by July 1 of 2008 and by April 1 of each succeeding year.
- (4) Annual adjustments made by the municipal utilities commission shall not be made for the purpose of securing additional long-term debt for capital needs. Recommendations for adjustments to the water, wastewater, and solid waste user charges that will generate additional revenues to satisfy debt service for capital needs and which will require additional long-term debt shall be made by the municipal utilities commission for consideration by the board of commissioners of the city.

The public may be provided fire hydrant meter service at the discretion of and subject to the policies of the Winchester Municipal Utilities Commission.

In addition to the foregoing service charge and refundable deposit, the customer shall pay for water usage, taxes, and Kentucky River Authority fee at the bulk water rate in effect at the time the fire hydrant meter is in use.

There will be an additional charge for "unaccounted for" water if a meter assembly has been tampered with to attempt bypassing or to alter the meter reading and in such case the entire refundable deposit will be forfeited as a penalty and service will be discontinued in addition to other penalties authorized by law or ordinance.

If not otherwise forfeited, the refundable deposit shall be used first to cover the cost of damage to the meter assembly or fire hydrant, if any, upon return of the meter assembly and second to cover the cost of water used through the meter and hydrant for which payment has not been received. If the final water usage bill or cost of repair should exceed the refundable deposit, the customer will be billed direct for the excess but if such deductions shall leave a balance of the refundable deposit, it shall be refunded upon return of the meter and completion of the customer's responsibilities under ordinance and utilities commission policy.

If a customer requires relocation of the meter to another hydrant, a nonrefundable relocation fee shall be charged. The customer shall pay no additional non-refundable deposit except that the applicant shall pay such additional deposit as shall be required to make the deposit balance equal to that required for the connection being used.

Where it is shown to the satisfaction of the Winchester Municipal Utilities Commission that a substantial quantity of the water consumed by the owner or occupant served by the system does not flow on a regular and continuing basis into the wastewater collection and treatment system, the Commission may, by order entered in its minutes, permit such owner or occupant to meter the water not flowing into the wastewater collection and treatment system and may exclude such metered quantity of water in calculating the wastewater volumetric usage charge.

Any customer requesting or receiving such exclusion from its wastewater utility charges shall provide authorized representatives of the Winchester Municipal Utilities Commission reasonable access to such areas of the customer's premises as may be deemed necessary by said representatives in order to ascertain that such water is not flowing into the sanitary sewer system.

All meters installed pursuant hereto shall be supplied, installed, and maintained by the Winchester Municipal Utilities; provided, however, that the customer shall pay to the Winchester Municipal Utilities the cost of said meter installation and maintenance.

Any customer receiving such exclusion shall pay a monthly fee to defray the costs of reading and maintaining additional meters and shall pay all other costs directly related to the providing of this service.

All revenues received pursuant to section 14-81.5.1, which are in excess of the sewer connection charges collected in fiscal year 2006-2007, shall be applied to principal payment of the loan obligation payable to the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority for construction of the publicly owned treatment works, from the effective date of this section until December 1, 2010, at which time this section shall be deemed repealed without future action by the commission.

(a) *Residential and non-residential solid waste schedules.* [The following sections 14-81.6.1 and 14-81.6.2 establish residential and non-residential solid waste utility rate schedules.]

(b) *State environmental surcharge.* A charge of forty-five cents (\$0.45) per month for solid waste customers shall be shown on all solid waste bills as a separate item and identified as a "state environmental surcharge." The "state environmental surcharge" shall be adjusted in proportion to the fee assessed per KRS Chapter 224, Subchapter 43.

If a customer's business establishment, business function, co-exists and operates in the same physical space as that customer's residential establishment, residential function, the commercial rate for solid waste utility service shall apply to the entire establishment.

If a customer's business establishment and residential establishment do not co-exist and operate in the same physical space, even if located under the same roof and being served by one meter

at the same street address, each establishment will be charged a separate solid waste utility charge based upon the definitions contained in section 14-82.

Curbside yard waste collection and disposal service is provided to residential customers at no additional cost. Yard waste curbits are available for customer convenience and rental for the residential customer. The charge for the yard waste curbit shall be \$16.45 annually and shall be billed as a one-time charge on the combined utility bill due in May of each year.

Curbside large trash collection and disposal service is provided to residential customers at no additional cost. Said service is limited to one pickup per month per service address and customer must call the transfer station to request pickup. (Ord. No. 27-99, § VII, 12-15-99; Ord. No. 10-2007, § I, 10-2-07; Ord. No. 4-2010, § 1, 1-25-10)

**Sec. 14-81.6.2. Commercial, industrial, and other non-residential rate schedules.**

Commercial, industrial, and other non-residential establishments shall be provided with containerized solid waste services commensurate with their solid waste disposal needs.

The curbit service with one 90-gallon curbit furnished at a minimum monthly non-residential charge of \$34.95. Effective August 1, 2000, the minimum monthly non-residential charge shall be \$34.95. Non-residential customers may, depending upon solid waste disposal needs, be required to or may optionally rent additional curbits. The monthly charge for curbit rental shall be \$2.06 per curbit rented. The charge for disposal of additional curbits in excess of one per pickup is \$4.37 per additional curbit.

Customers in the downtown central business district may, at the discretion of the Winchester Municipal Utilities, be provided bag program service in lieu of curbit service. Where this service is provided, up to 20 bags per month will be provided to the customer included in the minimum monthly charge. Additional bags may be purchased at a rate of \$1.20 per bag.
