

Big Sandy Water District has recently began working with a contract that will provide some basic mapping of their system which can be used to plan and track progress. Staff has attended both Kentucky Rural Water and Division of Water training on the process and documentation of lead service lines.

Though it is unlikely that any lead service lines exist in a system as new as Big Sandy, this will allow them to see the areas checked and easily weed out areas that are known new lines. Some homes in their service area are likely to be affected but it is not anticipated that any Big Sandy owned lines will be.

Affected homes will be documented and a notification system is in place as a part of their customer tracking/billing system. Identifying which customers will be affected is the first priority should they receive funding.

Goal 1: Identify possible affected homes using PVA data/local knowledge.

Goal 2: Begin notification cycle to affected households.

Goal 3: Replace any identified distribution lines.

Goal 4: Final documentation of all findings, replacements, and unresolved issues.
